A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, every school day in North Carolina more than 14,000 school buses carry over 775,000 students to and from school; and

WHEREAS, bus drivers travel thousands of miles navigating dirt roads, bypasses and multi-lane highways, to deliver students to their schools and homes safely; and

WHEREAS, weather and road conditions, other motorists and student passengers can sometimes create special challenges to drivers as they carry out their duties; and

WHEREAS, the breadth and scope of that responsibility is great compared to the compensation that often is available; and

WHEREAS, without school buses and school bus drivers, many public school students would not have safe, reliable transportation to and from school; and

WHEREAS, North Carolinians believe it is important to salute and appreciate school bus drivers and recognize the invaluable contributions they make to education and student safety;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, BEVERLY EAVES PERDUE, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 1-8, 2011, as "SCHOOL BUS DRIVER APPRECIATION WEEK" in North Carolina, and urge our citizens to recognize the excellence of our State's school bus drivers and their record of safety.
